

Affidavit Guidance notes

1. English Common Law and UK Legislation acknowledge King James V 1611 Bible is the basis for English Common Law, from which UK Legislation arose
2. Natural Law / Law of Creation / God's Law pre-exists all man-made laws and is the highest jurisdiction; Common Law pre-exists, and is therefore higher jurisdiction than UK Legislation, which is only a set of rules for commerce and has no jurisdiction over living wo/man without consent
3. The Affidavit of Asseveration of Truth and Fact is the foundational document for the correction of status and standing by rebuttal of all presumptions that the living wo/man is the same entity as the birth certificate Ens Legs, dead fiction, or acts as surety for the Ens Legis
4. This document is for guidance only, and is not intended and should not be used as a template.
5. Do not copy and paste. Be sure you fully innerstand it's meaning and your intention before using this an aid for creating your own Affidavit written in the way most suited to you and which you can most easily articulate should it become necessary
6. Look up words used and paragraphs quoted to be sure you comprehend the context. Albion/Alba/Eire/Cymru are old non-corporate names for England/Scotland/Ireland/Wales.
7. The Affidavit may be affirmed by a Notary Public or by two lay witnesses who are Executors (Living Executor documents can be found on Albion Sovereign Assembly's webpage: <https://albionsovereignassembly.org>)
8. Seal / shield / stamp: create your own online (e.g. <https://www.canva.com>) All documents sent by you should carry your own seal, which can be a simple as just your thumbprint, or a stamp or embosser seal

Glossary

“ **Asseverate**” – to solemnly declare. Asseveration is the act of asseverating : positive or emphatic affirmation or assertion

"**Negative averment**" – assert the non-existence of a fact, non-occurrence of an event, or denies a particular claim. It is used to refute claims made by an opposing party in legal proceedings.

"**Plain English**" – choose an English dictionary of your preference (e.g. Oxford/Collins/Webster's) and cite on your cover letter attached to your Affidavit. This specifies, the language used in your document is not legalese and should not be interpreted in any other way than by referral to the dictionary cited

“ **KJV 1611**” - King James V bible 1611, used in secular Courts

“ **Birth Certificate Clausula Rebus Sin Stantibus Invocavit**” - Legal process still used today in contract law to rescind, revoke and void contracts. Here, it particularly relates to the Birth Certificate fraud "contract" and all presumed and assumed "contracts" created after.

“**Affiant**’ - one who makes an affidavit

“**Jurat**” - a memorandum at the end of an affidavit showing when, before whom, and where it was affirmed
